

More than 50 miles of paved and natural surface trails accommodate a wide range of use including biking, hiking, and equestrian activities. Saylorville Lake is also listed as a global bio-preserve and significant bird area for waterfowl that use the lake during their spring and fall migrations.

# Important changes to payment options, reservations and pass availability in 2022

Due to the changing times, a few adjustments have been made at Saylorville Lake that we want to be sure everyone is aware of. First, and most importantly, cash and checks are no longer accepted at any campground or the administration office at Saylorville Lake. Debit and credit cards are the only forms of accepted payment for camping and day use fees. The gift shop at the Visitor Center will continue to accept cash, checks, and debit or credit cards for items purchased at the gift shop as it is operated by Saylorville Lake's cooperating association, The Iowa Academy of Science.

Campground operations at Acorn Valley and Bob Shetler Campgrounds will also be slightly different this year. These locations will have limited entrance booth hours, will not be accepting any form of payment for reservations, nor will they be selling or distributing passes. To make camping reservations, visitors must use the website: www.recreation. gov, download the recreation.gov app, or call the reservation help line at 877-444-6777. All Saylorville Lake campgrounds are 100% reservable, which allows you to make same day reservations if the site is available.

If you're interested in obtaining an America the Beautiful (ATB) Annual, Senior, Access, or Military Pass, or USACE Annual Passes, they are available for purchase at the Saylorville Lake Administration Office, Cherry Glen and Prairie Flower Campgrounds. And, new

for 2022, these passes will be available at the Saylorville Lake Visitor Center.

Another new addition is the ability to purchase a voucher for USACE annual passes at all boat ramp kiosks. These vouchers can then be redeemed for the USACE Annual Pass at designated locations within seven days. Designated locations include Cherry Glen or Prairie Flower Campgrounds, the Saylorville Lake Visitor Center, and the Saylorville Lake Administration office. As a reminder, Acorn Valley and Bob Shetler Campgrounds will NOT be selling or distributing passes of any kind.

#### Life jacket loaner stations



At Saylorville Lake, we take water safety seriously, and that's why life jacket loaner stations are now available at all U.S. Army Corps of Engineers designated boat ramps and beaches at the lake. Accidents can happen to anyone, at any time, and it is our goal to make water safety simple for those recreating at the lake.

Over the winter, an Eagle Scout offered to build seven new life jacket loaner stations to help improve water safety at Saylorville Lake. The new loaner stations are much nicer than the previous plastic stations. They have wooden frames, large hooks to hold the life jackets, and a large, easy-to-read, bi-lingual sign explaining how to properly fit a life jacket and the guidelines for using loaner station life jackets.

Life jackets housed on these stations are available on a firstcome, first-served basis and parents/guardians are responsible for making sure children are in the correct sized jacket. Remember, it only takes an average of 60 seconds for an adult to drown and 20 seconds for a child. If a life jacket doesn't fit, it can't work properly to save a life. As with all life jackets, loaner or not, it is important to inspect them before each use to be sure they are in proper working condition. Rips or tears can significantly reduce the effectiveness of the jacket. Borrowed jackets should always be returned to the loaner station when done being used so others can stay safe.

Saylorville Lake's life jacket loaner stations can be found at Lakeview High Water Boat Ramp, Lakeview Main Boat Ramp, Sandpiper Boat Ramp, Oak Grove Beach, Cherry Glen High Water Boat Ramp, and Cherry Glen Main Boat Ramp.














#### Walnut Ridge disc golf course improvements

Saylorville Lake rangers and volunteers have been hard at work improving infrastructure and aesthetics at the Walnut Ridge Disc Golf Course. With the growing popularity of the park and the sport of disc golf, Saylorville Lake staff thought it pertinent to implement some much-needed improvements. Improvements made in 2020 included: wooden picnic tables were replaced with new thermo-plastic-coated tables, trail surfaces routinely inundated by rain and runoff were regraveled, a culvert was replaced just beyond hole #14 to improve access to the next hole, and access was improved across a waterway on hole #7 with the installation of a boardwalk. Following the historic derecho storm last August, park rangers also performed area-wide hazard tree pruning and removal for increased safety to users, and new trees were planted throughout the course to replace trees lost to the storm.

Another improvement to the course was the creation of fairways and throwing lanes which are designed to aid in determining hole orientation and visibility. These fairways were created by mowing specific areas at a lower height and leaving grass on the edges longer to serve as "rough" like that of a traditional golf course. With feedback from the public and the Des Moines Disc Golf Club, Saylorville Lake staff altered the cut height of the rough areas for ease of finding discs and modified the size of the fairways to create a unique experience for those using the course.

Plans for further improvements are in the works for the upcoming year, and the Saylorville Lake staff aim to continue making Walnut Ridge Disc Golf Course a place where individuals and groups of all skill levels can come to recreate and relax.

# New archery range at Saylorville Lake hits the mark





The Saylorville Lake Archery Range, originally scheduled to open during the 2020 recreation season, officially opened for public use in July 2021 following postponement due to the COVID-19 pandemic and contract challenges. Since opening, the facility has been a big hit with local archers. The range is free for public use and is open sunrise to sunset year-round with temporary closures as needed for inclement weather. It can be reserved for youth groups and special events by contacting the Saylorville Lake Administration Office at 515-276-4656.

The facility, located in the Bob Shetler Recreation Area, just south of the administration building on the west side of the Saylorville Lake dam, offers a wide range of archery shooting options. A towering, six-station, elevated platform with three upper and

three lower shooting areas overlooks stationary targets at 20, 30 and 40 yards. This provides users with a "tree stand" feel and accommodates both experienced archers perfecting their precision and new archers learning to shoot from an elevated level. The range also provides five large stationary targets from ground level stations at 10, 20, 30, 40 and 50 yards and a bring your own target lane where targets can be set at distances of 10-50 yards.

"The new addition has seen a constant flow of visitors on weekdays and weekends with many learning to shoot or practicing for the Iowa hunting season," said Justin Edwards, Natural Resource Specialist at Saylorville Lake.

The range is open to standard bow and crossbow users but only "field tip" arrows are permitted at the range. Broadhead arrows are prohibited. Rules of the range and local hunting information are posted in a kiosk near the entrance of the range and can also be found on the Saylorville Lake website: https://www.mvr.usace. army.mil/Missions/Recreation/Saylorville-Lake/.

The new archery range was made possible through a partnership with several local organizations and businesses including the Carpenters Union - Local 106, Scouts BSA - Troop 202, Manatts, Martin Marietta, Sportsman's Warehouse, Bass Pro Shops, and the National Wild Turkey Federation - Central Iowa Longspurs.

### Working for us

Have you ever looked around Saylorville Lake's recreation areas and wondered what it takes to be part of the team keeping these areas enjoyable for all? It takes a dedicated team of staff, volunteers and contractors who are committed to providing quality outdoor recreation experiences while preserving and protecting our natural resources for the future. Full-time volunteers are required to "work" an average of about 21 hours per week, performing custodial, fee attendant, mowing, campground and Visitor Center hosting, as well as other position duties as assigned. In exchange for this service, volunteers receive a full hookup campsite in a corresponding campground or nearby volunteer village. Other perks include special gatherings with staff and fellow volunteers, the possibility to be chosen as a return volunteer in future years, the ability to gain life-long friends at the parks and the gratification in knowing you've become a good steward of the land.

Due to budget restraints, volunteers play a critical role in helping the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies operate facilities like Saylorville Lake. If you or anyone you know is interested in joining our team, please consider volunteering for one of our more than 30 positions. These roles can be filled by couples or an individual, as long as the duties can be completed. Many positions require a volunteer to "work" a few hours, five days per week while others are needed seven hours, three days per week. Volunteers without full-time jobs are preferred. Next, register your business with the System of Award Management (SAM). Then, identify contracting opportunities. And, lastly, submit a bid to the desired contract. # **Olofson Shooting Range**

The Olofson Shooting Range was completely renovated in 2017 by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. The range is operated by the Iowa DNR and staffed by range safety officers. It is designed as a public facility that allows an opportunity to shoot all types of firearms. We feature a new registration/classroom building, 33 shooting lanes on a 30/50/100 yard range, shotgun sports including trap and skeet, along with a 3D and static archery range. This satisfies almost any shooting need in a safe, welcoming environment.


**Hours and cost:** The range is open year round from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays (closed Monday and Tuesday). The basic charge is \$10 per hour for the range usage or \$6 per round of 25 for the shotgun sports. We do not rent firearms or sell ammunition, so you must bring your own, although we do have targets available.

Olofson Shooting Range is closed: Jan. 1 (New Year's Day), Easter Sunday, July 4, Thanksgiving Day, Dec. 24 and Dec. 25.

Location and contact: We are located at 11652 N.W. Nissen Drive, in Polk City, Iowa. This is conveniently located between Saylorville and Big Creek Lake, just four miles north of Polk City. We can be reached at 515-795-4000.

Classes: We offer classes throughout the year, such as beginning shooting, hunter education, concealed carry, and a variety of outdoor skills topics. These classes are listed on the DNR website at https://register-ed.com/programs/iowa and registration is usually required.









#### **Facilities and activities**

Big Creek State Lake was created as part of the Saylorville project to protect Polk City from floods. A diversion dam, which forms the 866-acre Big Creek Lake, was primarily developed as a flood control project but also offers a wide variety of recreation. Big Creek State Park and the adjoining public hunting areas provide recreation for visitors of all ages and interests. The focal point of the 3,550-acre complex is the lake.

#### Picnicking/shelters

Shelters and picnic areas, a beach, playground, a multi-purpose sports field and several boat ramps provide a variety of outdoor recreation opportunities. Open picnic shelters, located in pleasant settings around the lake, can be reserved through the park reservation system. The brown picnic tables located at the shelters are handicapped accessible.

#### **Camping**

Camping is not permitted at Big Creek State Park. However, there are several large federal and county camping areas about four miles away on Saylorville Lake.

#### **Trails**

A 26-mile paved multi-use trail allows bicyclists and pedestrians to travel from

the beach south through the Saylorville Lake area all the way to Des Moines. A connection to the High Trestle Trail can be made by traveling east on 142nd Avenue for two miles. Eleven miles of snowmobile trails provide winter recreational opportunities. Big Creek is also popular with cross-country skiers.

## Lake activities (swimming, boating, fishing)

There are several construction projects that will affect boat ramp access for 2022. Construction can be expected April through October. All the boat ramp roads and parking are to be replaced during this process, and it's anticipated that this will improve access to Big Creek Lake users.

Big Creek Lake's clear water provides great family swimming fun. Refreshments are available at the beach during the swimming season. A large wooden play structure, accessible to the mobility impaired, is located at the beach. Disc golf, model air, softball and volleyball areas provide additional entertainment.

Big Creek Lake provides excellent fishing year-round. The lake's clear waters are stocked with crappie, bluegill, largemouth bass, walleye, channel catfish and muskie.


The lake is popular for a variety of boating activities. Any size motor may be operated at "no wake" (5 mph or less) speeds on the lake. Five modern boat ramps, three on the west side and two on the east, provide excellent access to the lake. A gravel ramp is located on the upper end of the lake. A fishing pier is accessible to the mobility impaired. Big Creek has a concessionaire that offers pontoon boats, kayaks, paddle boards, bicycles and more. 
#### Hunting


The state park is a wildlife refuge where hunting is not permitted. However, hunting is allowed on the lake itself and in designated public hunting areas around the lake. Upland areas open for hunting are marked with public hunting signs. Favorite game includes pheasants, rabbit, deer and squirrel. Waterfowl hunting is popular on the lake. 

#### Sleep Under the Stars

Whether by tent or a camper, Jester Park offers 148 campsites along the lakeshore and throughout the wooded hills overlooking Saylorville Lake. There are 80 electric sites, 68 primitive sites, including 4 walk-in sites, and 1 youth area. Camping rates are \$25 for electric, \$20 for nonelectric sites and youth group sites are \$25. During off-season, camping rates drop \$5 from April 1 - April 14 and October 16 - November 30. Online reservations are available for reservable campsites from April 1 – November 30, and can be reserved in advance through the reservation process at www.mycountyparks.com. Two shower houses are open from mid-April through mid-October. Those using first-come, first-served sites can set up and then register at the campground registration booth. Firewood is available for purchase within the park.

#### **Year-Round Cabin Getaways**





#### **Jester Park Miniature Golf Course**
